Grain Science and Indstry Ph.D. Student Awarded Internship from National Science Foundation

Ph.D. student, Meicen Liu was recently awarded a National Science Foundatio(GSI) n Non-Academic Research Internship for Graduate Students (INTERN). Liu's studies and research at GSI focus on examining the treatment of hydrothermal liquefaction wastewater (HTLWW) with a variety of bacterial and fungal as well as microalgal strains under different conditions and process designs for high-rate pollutant removal. She is

funded by the National Science Foundation and studies under Associate Professor, Dr. Yi Zheng, who is the Primary Investigator for the research project: "Collaborative Research: A Novel Biological Valorization of Hydrothermal Liquefaction Wastewater with Marine Protist and its Granulated Phenotype". Liu will be using her \$37,578 INTERN award to support her 2024 summer internship at Sandia National Laboratory, Livermore, CA.
